Have you heard? A group of highly engaged community members are planning a Community Garden for the Winston Heights-Mountview area. This garden will be located in the northwest corner of the field adjacent to the Winston Heights-Mountview Community Hall at 520, 27 Avenue NE. Plans are well on their way to break ground in 2014. This garden is going to be professionally landscaped with an emphasis on high structural and aesthetic standards. Plans include 40-50 rental plots, communal plots for sharing gardening resources, an education plot as part of a focus on learning, and a philanthropic plot for sharing harvests. The Community Garden will include a pergola, seating areas and acrylic pathway surfaces that will allow for wheelchair access and will provide an added colourful touch to the garden. This garden will grow an abundance of food and flowers and it will be used by both novice and experienced gardeners.





Building Safe Communities

Going on a Holiday?

Summer is here and a great time to enjoy a vacation! But before you do, make sure your home is as safe and secure as possible. The keys to protecting your home when you are on vacation are not just the ones you use in your deadbolt lock.

Below are a few tips to help reduce your risk:

- Double-check your insurance policy to find out if and when you require someone to check in on your home.
- Give a trusted neighbour or friend a key and trip details and ask them to check in on your home.
 - Don't advertise that you are going away.
- Create a lived-in appearance. Be sure the lawn is cared for while you are away and stop any newspapers or have flyers collected from your door or yard. Set lights and a radio/television on timers so your home is not dark during evening hours.
- Encourage a trusted neighbour to park their car in your driveway while you are gone.
- Ensure that your door and window locking devices are working and are locked when you leave.
- Disable your garage door while you are gone. Most have a switch that can be turned off. You can also put a padlock or similar device through the door tracks to ensure it cannot be opened.
- Put away, or secure all lawn furniture or tools (i.e. ladders) so they can't be used to assist a burglar in gaining access to the upper story windows of your home.

Edmonton Trail Road Reconstruction Project

The City of Calgary has a program in place dedicated to reconstructing Calgary's aging roadways. Edmonton Trail, from 16 Avenue to 41 Avenue, is the next major roadway on the list for reconstruction. The project will be completed over two years in phases:

Phase 1 – 2013: 28 to 41 Avenues N.E.

Phase 2 – 2014: 28 to 16 Avenues N.E.

The primary focus of this work is on removing the existing pavement and rebuilding the roadway to improve the road's condition. The road will not be widened during construction. Streetlights will be replaced and sidewalks and driveways will be rebuilt. Any existing landscaping disturbed during construction will be repaired.

Construction start

Construction in the area from 34 to 41 Avenues NE is expected to start in late June. In this area, a storm sewer upgrade will also be undertaken at 35 Avenue, which will involve closing Edmonton Trail at 35 Avenue for short time period. Details of this closure will be provided at a later date. The storm sewer upgrade is needed to increase the capacity of the drainage system in the area to meet the current and future needs.

As construction progresses, the work area will grow to include the area from 28 Avenue to 32 Avenue. Please watch roadways signs and the web page for updates about the timing on the various stages of construction. A water main replacement will also be completed in this area. This utility work may involve also involve short-term road closures and localized interruptions to water service.

The construction work from 28 to 41 Avenues will continue until the end of the construction season in fall 2013. The road will be fully open to four lanes of traffic at the end of construction season. Any work not completed in the fall, such as landscaping or other minor cleanup work, will be completed the following spring.

Construction impacts

Every effort will be made to keep impacts to a minimum, but construction will cause traffic delays and limit access to roadways and driveways at different times. Any business, residence or service directly impacted by construction will receive information notices explaining the impacts.

In general, these are the impacts that people will experience during construction:

- Traffic will be limited to one lane in each direction on Edmonton Trail and delays should be expected.
- Intersecting roads, alleys, and driveways may be closed periodically throughout construction.
- The use of large trucks and other equipment will create noise and dust. The City of Calgary works with their contractors to keep noise and dust disturbance to a minimum.
 - Bus stops may be closed or re-located.


16 Ave and 19 St NE Interchange

The City of Calgary is conducting a functional planning study to determine plans for a future interchange and land requirements at the intersection of 16 Avenue and 19 Street N.E. The study will also look at providing more connectivity for people who walk, cycle and take transit.

While there is currently no funding available to construct this interchange, it is identified as a priority in The City's 10-year transportation capital infrastructure plan called Investing in Mobility. Conducting the study now to identify an interchange configuration is important so construction can proceed quickly if funding becomes available. The Council-approved Municipal Development and Calgary Transportation Plans guide this study.

The project team will work closely with stakeholders and the community throughout the study process to develop a preferred concept that considers the short-term and long-term transportation issues at this intersection. Identifying hazards in products

Health Canada Encourages Canadians to Report Health or Safety Concerns with Consumer Products

Many of us have experienced health or safety issues after coming into contact with a consumer product, such as a toy, household product or sporting good. These issues can arise for many reasons: the product did not function properly, it broke suddenly or was not properly labeled with important information. Health Canada is encouraging Canadians to play a role in identifying hazards in consumer products and reporting problems as soon as possible to the manufacturer, the retailer or to Health Canada.

By reporting hazardous products, you have the opportunity to protect others from injury by providing industry and Health Canada with the right information to take action as appropriate. In turn, the reporting of another consumer might just protect you from the hazards of an unsafe consumer product.

Common hazards and concerns with consumer products might include a child's toy that breaks and presents a choking, inhalation or ingestion hazard from small parts; electronics which may pose a risk of fire; sporting equipment which may not properly protect from injury; or household chemicals that are not appropriately packaged or labelled which may pose the risk of poisoning to children.

Under the Canada Consumer Product Safety Act, which came into effect in June 2011, industry has an obligation to sell, import, manufacture or advertise consumer products which do not pose a danger to human health or safety. Industry also has an obligation to report to Health Canada when they become aware of an incident related to a product that they manufacture or sell. The Act provides Health Canada with stronger tools to investigate and take action when necessary to address health or safety hazards to Canadians from consumer products, which may include ordering the recall of products that do not comply with the law.

If you have a health or safety concern with a consumer product, take action by contacting:


