In the meantime, we have many great activities planned as we move into spring. I hope you come out and enjoy as many of them as you can.

Alderman's Message

Happy March, Winston Heights - Mountview! Council duties at City Hall have been busy through February with the Airport Tunnel, fluoride, the launch of our unprecedented Budget engagement, Enmax, and now secondary suites. Last month I promised a WHMV-specific update, so here it goes.

Over the past few months I've been working with the Federation of Calgary Communities, the University of Calgary, and citizens from Winston Heights - Mountview and Tuxedo Park to re-envision Edmonton Trail. On February 12th I participated in a workshop where over 20 Winston Heights - Mountview and Tuxedo Park residents came out. We spoke about the potential for a more mixed-use, transit-supported Main Street future for Edmonton Trail. As the natural connector between Tuxedo Park and WHMV and home of many of the communities' best businesses, Edmonton Trail deserves particular attention as we determine the future of our neighbourhoods. The University of Calgary students will be sharing their work with the community in late April, so stay tuned for details on what promises to be a very provocative and interesting event.

Finding certainty and securing community continue to be top priorities of mine as the Midfield Mobile Home Park saga continues to unfold. The frustrations expressed by the community at the way residents have been treated are not without merit, and my office is committed to finding the best-case solution for the residents of Midfield, WHMV, and the citizens of Calgary. Check out Episode 3 of Ward 9 TV, in which I visit Midfield to pass out letters outlining my support: <http://www.rabbitview.com/gian-carlo-carra/ward-9-tv-episode-3>.

In other news, the hot issue of secondary suites is on the drawing board again, heading to Council in early March. We've been hearing lots of feedback from WHMV residents, and are committed to finding the best solution for Ward 9's neighbourhoods. One of Mayor Nenshi's core campaign promises was to address Calgary's housing supply by legalizing secondary suites, thereby making current illegal suites safer for the tenant, more beneficial for the owner, and in line with the aspirations of Calgary's communities. We recognize the legitimate parking and community issues associated with secondary suites, but are also aware of the benefit that increased density can provide, when placed appropriately and responsibly.

The lines of communication at the Ward 9 Office are always open, and we love to hear your thoughts on the issues affecting Winston Heights - Mountview, Ward 9, and the City. Please email us at ward09@calgary.ca or give us a call at 403-268-2430.

Also, keep an eye out for our new website, www.gccarra.ca, and while you're on it, check out Ward 9 TV, our newest way of letting you know what we're up to. Look forward to hearing from you, Winston Heights, and stay warm these last few months of winter!

Newsletter Delivery Concerns

How often is the newsletter printed?

The newsletter is published ten times per year. Two issues are combined month issues - July/August and December/January.

Where is the newsletter delivered?

All homes, apartments and condos in your community should receive the newsletter.

How is the newsletter delivered?

Your community newsletter is delivered by Canada Post except for a small section in the NE of the community. This area is delivered by the Girl Guides.

Who pays for the delivery?

The Winston Heights - Mountview Community Association pays for the newsletter delivery.

If I have a 'no-flyers' sign on my mailbox how do I get the newsletter?

Community newsletters are classified as official information and, as such, **must be delivered by Canada Post** to every address on every letter-carrier route. There are no options for non-delivery of official information mail-outs.

If you don't receive your newsletter...

We need your help to monitor the delivery and to report delivery problems.

If you, your friends or neighbours are not receiving the newsletter please follow these steps:

- 1) Talk to your letter-carrier or leave a note or a sign on your mailbox insisting on delivery.
- 2) Call Canada Post at 1-800-267-1177 and insist they initiate a case file and reply to you with an explanation. Be persistent!
- 3) E-mail ellisevansdesign@shaw.ca and provide your address and postal code.

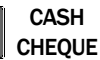

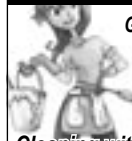
